Northern District Land Use Update by Adam Mehlberg

Canyon Lakes Ranger District:

Waiting on analysis of the 2013 flood road closures. The Supervisors Office of the Roosevelt National Forest needs to determine when, or if, the remaining closed roads from the flood will get opened.

Boulder Ranger District:

Jenny Creek FR502.3 - Planning a 4WD road review for August 20th, meet

in Rollinsville at 9:00am.

Bunce School Road FR105 - OHV outfitters out of Estes Park will be under a permit with the Boulder Ranger District for recreational use. They will work with NORAC on education and maintenance in the Bunce School area. June 11-12 cleanup and camp-out, meet at U-Pump-It in Lyons at 8:30am.

Caribou FR505 - Adopt-A-Road review to happen July 10th, snow level permitting.

Kingston Peak FR353 - NORAC scheduled to review the road for opening on June 26 (They are working with the Boulder District.) Rising Sun 4WD Club may be picking up Kingston on the Clear Creek District side.

Miller Rock FR252 - Repair work project at the main obstacle to stabilize the downhill side of the road. June 18th, meet at the north Wal-Mart in Longmont at 8:00am.


Walker Mountain FR509 - On the Boulder Ranger District flood repair list. Will remain closed for the time being.

Middle St. Vrain FR114 - Need to replace the two traffic control posts that go next to the host building. Will need to install new Wilderness trail head sign at the Middle St. Vrain Wilderness trail head. First water crossing needs to be controlled to a single route. Will be doing a two day project with a camp out. June 25th meet at the Middle St. Vrain trail head parking lot at 9 a.m.

Coney Flats FR507 - Small pond at top will need ingress control to keep vehicles out of the pond. Use natural barriers, add "No Motorized" signs. Part of the Middle St. Vrain work weekend June 25.

Lefthand Canyon OHV FR286 - Now open to hiking and mountain biking. Access is an issue as the old entrance can not be used. Lefthand will have a new plan written and presented for public review. Planning could take two to five years. Planning will need to be budgeted. Lead mitigation project and Trouts Unlimited stream restoration project completed. Restoration removed the old road bed and routed stream so that the old entrance can no longer be used as an entrance.



Now that Memorial Day has passed, the summer activities in the mountains will start to ramp up. If you have done, or are planning on doing, volunteer work on our public lands, please remember to report it to me as soon as possible. Lately the Forest Service has become more interested in working with its volunteer groups to offset its shortage of resources. It can be hard to get in contact with the public lands managing agencies, so persistence is required. If you have a good working relationship with the agencies it is important to maintain the communication.

Hours reported this year are shown in the summary chart below.

** Deadline for 2016 hours is September 15 **

Any hours reported after this date will go into 2017 and will be reported to the managing agencies late, which will not help them in their annual reports.

On Saturday morning, May 14, more than 40 volunteers joined Stay The Trail and the Bureau of Land Management, Colorado River Field Office at the Castle Peak Recreation area north of Gypsum, CO to install new signs on four (4) extreme rock crawling trails and to perform an area-wide cleanup effort. The Hi-Country Four Wheelers Club was instrumental in working with the land manager to ensure that these very unique off-road opportunities were included in the BLM's new travel management plan. Many of those who volunteered this day are also club members and it is safe to say that these amazing trails would not exist, let alone have become official routes, without the persistent hard work of the





individuals that make up this group of four wheeling enthusiasts. This project is a great example of a motivated group of users taking ownership and becoming true stewards of the public lands that they love to enjoy.


Through a special signage grant funded by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife OHV Registration Program, Stay The Trail was able to work with the club to secure the means necessary to have the four (4) permanent steel signs constructed. These signs were then securely set in concrete at the trailheads for each of the following rock crawl routes; **Tierod Bender, Middle Middle, Upper Middle,** and **Ten Falls** respectively. Each sign indicates the trail's name and displays a 1 through 10 difficult rating for each route. A list of recommended 4X4 equipment is also listed on each sign to ensure that those who enter these extreme routes are well prepared. The signs also display the BLM and Stay The Trail logos

as well as the 'OHV Registration Dollars at Work' emblem to remind users to always register their off road vehicles and see that those funds are used to protect, create, and maintain off-highway recreational opportunities.

In addition to installing these signs, volunteers worked together in a massive area-wide cleanup effort which yielded almost 40 cubic yards of debris, two dozen old tires, and an abandoned appliance. Club members also worked into the following day to run the trails, perform corridor clearing, and install winch anchor points at key obstacles.

Overall this project was a great success and serves as an example of what can be accomplished when individuals work together with land managers and organizations such as Stay The Trail to preserve off-road vehicle opportunities on public lands.






NoCo4Lo News, by Kerry Beach
