

Coney Flats – Sign project

For our fall project on Coney Flats this year we installed two trail head signs at the Coney Flats Wilderness boundary and one at the start of the Beaver Creek Trail. September 26 was the date and it turned out to be a nice day for the work. We had a lot of people show to haul up the five 8 inch by 10 foot treated posts, the three new panels, and assorted tools, including the club generator.

After transferring and organizing the materials our slow caravan headed up the Coney Flats road. The 4WD road was dry and for the most part in good shape. Once at the flats the Forest Service (Maribeth and Kariann) had a quick meeting to go over the projects we would be doing. One project was to remove the existing two sided kiosk and then replace it with the new larger kiosk. Another project was to repair the posts on the old

Wilderness sign and re-seat the parking barriers. The last project was to install new trail head sign at the Beaver Creek trailhead.

We all headed to different projects and the Trailridge Runners got to work. I helped with the wilderness sign repair. We disassembled the old sign and pulled out the old supports, one of them having



been repaired with a couple of sticks and bailing wire. Since the old treated logs that were the supports for the old kiosk were not needed we pulled two of those to use as new supports for the wilderness sign. The holes needed to be enlarged, which took a little work. Once we got the post in the holes for the sign were marked and drilled.

While we were doing that, others were up-righting one of the parking barrier logs and placing it back into new holes dug into the ground.



After bolting the old wilderness sign onto its new “legs” it was about time for lunch.



Coney Flats has a great place for lunch in the shade on the east side of the road. We all took a nice shady lunch break and enjoyed the views of the continental divide.

After lunch the group on the Coney Creek trailhead sign continued working on the holes and support posts. Our group headed across Coney Creek to the location of the Beaver Creek trailhead. Maribeth decided on the location and we got to work. One small old sign was removed and a new barrier log put in to block off a user created bypass from the trailhead back to the Coney Flats road. The two new holes we needed to dig were almost easy compared to the holes on the flats. We verified our depth to be three quarters of a Raymond.

We got the support post cut to length and placed in the holes while the sign cross supports were getting laid out and pre-drilled. Once all the pieces were ready the cross supports were installed and then the new trailhead sign was bolted on.

By now the other group had finished the Coney Creek sign and we loaded up the tools and scrap material to take back out. It was about 4:30 p.m. when we headed back to Beaver Reservoir. After sorting out the tools to their proper owners we were thanked once again my Kariann and Maribeth for our volunteer efforts. It turned out to be a long, but successful day.

Middle St. Vrain, Coney Flats, Caribou, and Bunce School Road have all been seasonally closed.




In Memory of Darrel Turner, by Kerry Beach

Adopt-A-Road / Volunteer Projects, by Adam Mehlberg

The total volunteer hours for the 2015(FS fiscal year) is over 15,800 hours, of that 4,246 hours were reported late and are from the 2014 season. That still puts us at over 11,600 hours reported in the 2015 season. The total 15,800+ hours have been reported to the public lands managing agencies. The adjusted 11,600 hours will be used to calculate each clubs hours per member number for the annual awards.

Hours reported this year are shown in the summary chart on the next page newsletter.

**** Deadline for 2016 hours is September 15 ****

Any hours reported after this date will go into 2017 and will be reported to the managing agencies late, which will not help them in their annual reports.


Remember that the drive time to and from the project counts.

2015 Longmont Parade of Lights





