Canyon Lakes Ranger District: No updates no meetings.

Boulder Ranger District:


Bunce School Road FR105 (Backbone ATV) – Bunce School does not seasonally close and will be open through the winter. Caribou FR505 (NORAC) – Seasonal closure in December.

Kingston Peak FR353 (NORAC/Rising Sun) – September 24 Cleanup completed. Forest Service multi-club run of Kingston Peak done on September 30. The U.S. Forest Service's Clear Creek Ranger District closed Kingston Peak Road two weeks early, Oct 16, due to safety concerns as a result of snow conditions. While the road typically closes for the season Oct. 30, several vehicles got stuck there, requiring rescue and bringing attention to safety conditions on the road.

Middle St. Vrain FR114 (Trailridge Runners) – Mud bog repair is holding. Seasonal closure run completed on November 26. Middle St. Vrain and Coney Flats were snow covered and icy. Host site was closed.







Report of Officers and Clubs President – Ige Gustavson

Northern District VP – Open

Big Thompson worked on the Hessie Road Trail and did a vehicle recovery

Larimer County "The Mountaineers" did some trail clean ups, adopted five new trails, organized and ran the Santa Cops Toy Drive at 4 Wheel Parts in Loveland. Working on a getting a State Trust Land Lease or easement to access to trails. NORAC logged 1,300 hours of volunteer hours working on trails. Reported that T-33, Iron Clad, Caribou and Kingston Peak are now closed for the season.

Trail Ridge Runners worked on the Middle St. Vrain trail and held a Rollins Pass Pot Luck Dinner. Planning a Moab Trip in 2018 and opening Miller Rock Trail if the NFS can get the rocks moved and this will lead to other trails being open also.
